Assessment Details
<p>Each unit is blended with theory and practical elements, with the exemption of unit 101 and 005 (Theory only).</p> <p>The theory is assignment based - graded Pass, Merit, Distinction (See grade descriptors below)</p> <p>Pass- Minimum information provided to meet criteria. Merit- Detail information provided to meet criteria. Clear structure and well presented. Distinction- In depth information provided to meet criteria. Clear structure and well presented. Work is clearly referenced.</p> <p>*A pass grade can only be achieved if the assignment is handed in after the submission date.</p> <p>The practical is observation based - formative and summative assessment observations. You will always be given notice in advance of a summative observation. Summative assessment outcomes are Pass or Refer. You are able to re-sit a summative assessment if required.</p> <p>*If you do not agree with any assessment decision you have the right to appeal. Appeals procedure is displayed in the classroom, and explained in the following section, staff roles.</p> <p>Students will work on the theory elements of 101,102 and 112. They will then practice hair and beauty skills in practical lessons to prepare for a summative assessment of unit 112 and 102 in</p>

June to complete the Award. Students will create an image on head blocks, a member of staff or a family member, whilst maintaining a professional image.
 Students that are working above expectations, there is the opportunity to work towards the certificate by completing additional units of their choice.

Staff Roles

Miss Emery will be delivering Hair and Beauty theory and practical lessons. She will be your lead teacher and assessor. Mrs Currell will be your Internal Quality Assurer (IQA). Mrs Chadderon is our External Quality Assurance (EQA). The IQA and EQA will check you are being taught to required standards. If you have a complaint, you can raise it with Mrs Chadderon. She will visit once a year onsite. (See appeals procedure poster on the classroom wall)

Equipment/ Health and Safety

All Equipment will be provided by SESC. Students have a realistic working salon environment to learn in.

Students will have the opportunity to attend trips based around the hair and beauty industry and unit topics. For example:

- Make- up workshops
- Hair and Beauty exhibitions
- Local salon experience/visits
- College visits
- Visitors, talks and demos
- Theatre Experience

Students will have the opportunity to make some cross curricular links. For example:

- Cooking where they can use plaiting techniques with dough and pastry as part of unit 004.
- Art where they are able to create face painting designs in the style of an artist as part of unit 107. Develop art work from nail art designs. Mixing of colours primary/ secondary/tertiary as part of unit 005, 111 and 112.
- English, a selection of reading books based around the hair and beauty industry are provided. Speaking and listening skills. Key words are provided for each lesson/unit and a glossary for hair and beauty.
- Hair and make-up services provided for the Christmas play as part of unit 103, 104, 107 and 106.
- CEIAG as part of unit 101.

Next Steps

This qualification gives the student the opportunity to have a taster of many different areas within the hair and beauty industry. It can inspire students to follow a specific, chosen career path. This qualification not only gives creative skills, it develops transferable, employability skills and is the equivalent to a GCSE.
